Both types of exercise help maintain bone density, too.

**Journey to New Life** is a program for men and women to receive help Case management and resources. It is located at 3120 Troost Ave.

**Journey House** is located at 2918 Tracy Ave. This is a home for women to live who have transitioned out of prison. Journey House houses 15 women and works with them to provide health care, mental health and dental work.

They can reside at Journey House for 3 weeks to 90 days. Journey House provides a place for them to live until they get work, or get a GED, and then they provide an apartment for them to live independently. When ready they are provided their "apartments' everything": Beds, tables, chairs, lamps, kitchen ware, clock radios, microwaves, toasters, coffee pots, lamps, dressers and beddings: blankets, sheets and mattress covers. # THE SPIRITUAL WORKS OF MERCY ARE ACTS OF LOVE

- 1. **Admonish the sinner**. Try to make another realize how bad sin is by trying to keep the person out of an occasion of sin.
- 2. **Instruct the ignorant.** Help others in one way or another to learn the truths they need to know to save their souls.
- 3. **Counsel the doubtful**. Help others to speak the truth in love to their neighbors.
- 4. **Comfort the sorrowful**. Help another person in any kind of sorrow, and refrain from doing anything that would unnecessarily cause another person more sorrow.
- 5. **Bear wrongs patiently**. Accept the consequences of another's thoughtlessness or carelessness.
- 6. **Forgive all injuries**. Forgive all those who have injured us in any way, even deliberately and with malice.
- 7. **Pray for the living and the dead.** Sharing in the communion of saints asks that we pray for everyone.

# THE CORPORAL WORKS OF MERCY ARE ACTS OF LOVE

- 1. *Feed the Hungry*. Help others to obtain their bodily nourishment. Examples: share your food or candy, help with the cooking and doing dishes.
- 2. *Give drink to the thirsty*. What is said of food also applies to drink.
- 3. *Clothe the naked.* Help others obtain clothing, help someone get dressed, help with laundry.
- 4. *Visit the imprisoned.* Help people who suffer dangers to freedom. Examples: Write to someone in jail, help someone who is being bullied.
- 5. **Shelter the homeless.** Help the homeless obtain shelter or to preserve the home they have. Examples: Support a homeless shelter by cleaning, dusting, mowing the grass.
- 6. *Visit the sick.* Anything that can be done for someone in need.
- 7. **Bury the dead.** Show respect for the bodies of the dead. Examples: Go to funerals and wakes, treat cemeteries with respect, put flowers on a grave.
