Reflection from Sr. Helen Flemington The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

God our Creator, is the very source of our life. We were, as it were, conceived in the womb of God. It is from that we receive every breath, every heartbeat, and every bit of blood flowing through our wonderful bodies. God is the Giver of all life and of all nourishment.

And in giving us the Eucharist, God wants to nourish us with the best of all possible foods—His Son, Jesus Christ. We do believe that when we receive Holy Communion, we are receiving in a real, though mysterious way, our Lord himself. This has to be the most powerful sign possible of God's desire to nourish us.

And aren't we fed in so many different and countless ways by God. There is a poem that starts: *How do I love thee, let me count the ways*. We could imagine these words as coming from God. If we even made a small beginning on our list of things to be grateful for, it could become quite overwhelming. We are constantly being nourished by God. The Eucharist is in some ways the greatest sign of all the different ways that God nourishes us. God is telling us that God wants to nourish us in every possible way.

When we take the Eucharist, we are saying yes to Jesus, but at the same time we are saying yes to providing nourishment to all of our brothers and sisters in Christ. The relationships are all interwoven: Christ nourishing us; we nourish one another; we receiving nourishment from one another. This is why the Eucharist is the central Sacrament of our Church. It gives us life and demands that we give life to others.




