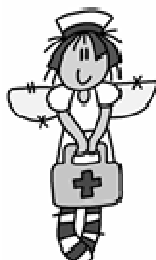

Health Corner: Alcohol Before Bedtime

Is there a downside to having a glass or two of wine, or another alcoholic drink, before bedtime? Alcohol before bed may disrupt your slumber and leave you drowsy the next day, a recent study confirms. Over time, that may interfere with memory formation. Alcohol can disrupt the body's normal sleep pattern. Usually, you cycle between different phases of sleep, all crucial to a good night's rest. But when you drink before bed, research has



found, those cycles are disrupted, resulting in more awakenings and thus lower-quality, less refreshing sleep.
