

Reflection from Sr. Helen Flemington



Fourth Sunday of Lent

It is the spiritual blindness that we need to reflect on today. It is one of the most difficult problems in the whole spiritual life. We

choose not to see. Others can point out where we are blind. They can talk to us till they are blue in the face, but until we make the decision to open our eyes, all of their talking will be useless. Until we can cry out, "Lord, help me to see", nothing will work. At times we may get shocked into taking a realistic look at our lives; for a while it seems that we are able to see, but all too often we slip back into our blindness, into our denial. We do this because staying with our new sight means making new decisions about our lives—about our drinking, about our relationships, about our prejudices, about our spending, about the way we treat our bodies and so forth. Our new insight may tell us that we must change, but for the blind person, there is no 'must'—there is no 'have to' – it's easier, we think, to stay in our blindness, than to have to deal with our life as it really is.

Health Corner: Our Parish Nurse

You may have heard, or seen on the cover of the bulletin, that St. Therese has a Parish Nurse. She is Sr. Helen Alder, RN. She is available to everyone in the parish. Normally she visits the homebound all day Tuesday and Wednesday, but at times she can adjust her schedule to fit the needs of parishioners. She visits the homebound, those in the hospital, nursing homes and rehab centers. She brings Communion to



parishioners who are unable to attend Mas for long periods of time. She will check blood pressures, help with explaining medications, diets, disease processes and she is always happy to just listen to concerns. She has helped with working

through problems with health care institutions, applying for assistance, obtaining equipment, filling out Living Wills/Durable Power for Health Care Attorney, choosing a Skilled Nursing Facility or Rehab center and planning for funerals. She attends the 9:15 Mass but tries to come early and stay a while after Mass so that anyone from either Mass can talk to her. If she hasn't visited you when you were ill it is because she wasn't aware of your illness or hospitalization. Her phone number is 816-942-2746 and she has an answering machine.


