Easter Sunday

Many years ago there was a little girl whose name was Annie. "Little Annie" was judged to be hopelessly insane. As a young girl she was kept in a cage on the lowest level of a Boston asylum. The doctors saw no hope for her, so she was confined to a damp, dark basement. A nurse had a special compassion for this hopeless child, and she began to eat her lunch just outside her cage. One day the nurse left some brownies outside of Annie's cage. The girl didn't seem to care. The nurse left them anyway, and on her return, the brownies were gone. They began to eat lunch together, and the little girl began to talk to the nurse.

The doctors began to notice a change in the young girl, and soon she was moved to the main floor. She began to show great improvement, and after several years of treatment they felt she was well enough to return to her home. But this young woman decided to stay at the asylum and help others who were without hope, as she had been. It was "Little Annie" who grew up to give help to Helen Keller and others like her. "Little Annie" was Anne Sullivan, the miracle worker.

The nurse carried hope in her heart for that little girl. And then she showed this hope by loving her in the simplest and most profound way. And eventually hope was born and grew in the heart of Annie Sullivan.

Christ is our hope. He has come through the most terrifying of all realities – death. And through his resurrection he has poured out hope for all of creation. That is why today is the greatest feast in the Church's year. Christ's resurrection is like a father whispering to his new-born daughter. "Don't be afraid. I'll take care of you no matter what."

We are responsible for one another, like Anne Sullivan was. It is through this awareness of solidarity with all of humanity that we will bring the message of Easter hope to the world. Each of us as individuals, and all of us as community, have to be constantly searching for ways to bring this awareness of hope to the world.
