

## Reflection from Sr. Helen Flemington

### Passion/Palm Sunday

Our culture is not well adapted to dealing with pain. Pain is today's unmentionable reality, yet it needs to be named for what it is. Covering our pain up with drugs, alcohol, television or shopping is not release from the pain. It is really just giving in to the pain. It is letting pain run our lives instead of letting love run our lives.

I read the book "The Shack" about five years ago and then I went to the movie a week ago. The main character is Mack. His life is filled with pain from his childhood and then a tragedy as a father. He was filled with so much pain that he could not get out of it by himself. It was God who showed him the way and he was released from his harsh life. I recommend that you read the book and see the movie.

Facing our pain, admitting the darkness in our lives, is never easy. That is why courage is the most essential virtue on our spiritual journey. If we fail to let pain be pain, we will become the victims of pain instead of the healers we are called to be. We must learn to embrace pain long enough so that we might truly let it go.

Jesus did not seek the cross. Yet, when it was handed to him, he did not refuse it. He took the cross, knowing in his heart that he was carrying the cross of each one here. It is true that Jesus became human at his birth, but he also became human in a very profound way when he accepted his cross.

As we move through this Holy Week, may we each come to know in our hearts that the Savior is with us, walking with us, supporting us, carrying our cross along with his own.

We rejoice with **Michele Vanoni** who will receive the Sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist at the Easter Vigil. We also rejoice with the Jesse and Helen Frazier family whose two boys, **Jayshawn and Jeremiah**, will be baptized at the Easter Vigil. Our St. Therese community is blessed during this season.

### Triduum at St. Therese:

Holy Thursday, April 13 Mass of the Lord's Supper, 7pm. The gospel reading here focuses on the washing of the feet but the other evangelists focus on the institution of the Eucharist at this last meal.



"The Eucharist is a prayer of helplessness, a prayer for God to give us a unity we cannot give to ourselves. It is not incidental that Jesus instituted it in the hour of his most intense loneliness, when he realized that all the words he had spoken hadn't been enough and that he had no more words to give.

When he felt most helpless, he gave us the prayer of helplessness, the Eucharist. Our generation, like every generation before it, senses its helplessness and intuitively its need for a messiah from beyond. We cannot heal ourselves and we cannot find the key to overcome our wounds and divisions all on our own. So we must turn our helplessness into a Eucharistic prayer, that asks God to come and do for us what we cannot do for ourselves, namely, create community, and we must go to the Eucharist for this same reason. 
