"Be dressed for action, and have your lamps lit."

Health Corner:

Preparing For College

As your children prepare to go to college, they may get a directive from the college stating that the student needs a MENIGOCOCCAL VACCINATION. You

may be perplexed by this. Meningitis is a contagious disease that spreads rapidly among people living closely together, such as in dormitories. It can be fatal, and thus, colleges often require dormitory students to get this vaccination. Most health clinics and doctors' offices do not give this vaccination because it is very expensive. Your best bet is to get the injection at the county health department. Jackson County Health Dept. is at 313 Liberty. Independence, MO. Phone: 816-404-6415. They only give the shots on Mon., Tues., and Wed. and you must call two weeks in advance. They will then order the vaccine and let you know when to come for the shot. The cost is about \$75.00.
