2nd Sunday of Easter

After Jesus rose from the dead and began appearing to his friends, they somehow knew that was now to be different. There was something new in their lives. This person Jesus had powerfully drawn them into a new way of life. His life of love, his words of love, finally found their way into the hearts of his followers. They knew that to be faithful to Jesus they would have to follow Jesus.

And so we hear in the reading from the Acts of the Apostles these words: The whole group of those who believed were of one heart and soul, and no one claimed private ownership of any possessions, but everything they owned was held in common.

A tale is told about a minister in a small village in Russia who used to vanish every Friday for several hours. The villagers boasted that during those hours their minister ascended to heaven to talk with God. A skeptical newcomer arrived in town, determined to discover where the minister really was. One Friday morning the newcomer hid near the minister's house, watched him rise, say his prayers, and put on the clothes of a peasant. He saw him take an an ax and go into the forest, shop down a tree, and gather a large bundle of wood. The minister proceeded to a shack in the poorest section of the village where an old woman lived. He left her the wood, which was enough for the week. The minister quietly returned to his own house. The newcomer stayed on in the village and became a disciple of the minister. And whenever he hears one of his fellow villagers say, "On Friday morning our minister ascends all the way to heaven, "the newcomer quietly adds, "If not higher."

May God give us the grace to be people of the Resurrection--people who show by the way we treat others that we believe Jesus is risen and is with us.

Weekly Health Corner

April 8 Back Pain

Back pain is one of the most common reasons for visiting a health care provider. The pain can either be cervical (upper neck) pain or lumbar (low back pain). The causes can be caused

by muscle strain or spasm, ligament sprain, degenerative disk or herniation of the disk. Low back pain is one of the most common causes for compensating in the working population. Another cause of back pain is Spinal stenosis. Spinal stenosis is a narrowing of the spinal canal which is the open space within the spine. This narrowing puts pressure on the spinal cord and the nerves causing pain most often in the neck and lower back. Most people with spinal stenosis are over the age of 50. Treatment for spinal stenosis depends on the location of the stenosis and the severity of the signs and symptoms. There are many self-care tips that can be done at home. If these don't help, medications or physical therapy may be recommended. It's common for people who have spinal stenosis to become less active, in an effort to reduce pain. But that can lead to muscle weakness, which will result in more pain. A physical therapist can teach exercises that will help: 1) build up strength and endurance 2) maintain the flexibility and stability of the spine and 3) improve balance. Steroid injections are another option. While injecting a steroid medication (corticosteroid) into the space won't fix the stenosis, it can help reduce the inflammation and relieve some of the pain. Surgery may be an option if these treatments don't help.

during the week, so thanks to the Lectors who brought their best to help share the scriptures from Palm


Sunday through Easter Sunday.




