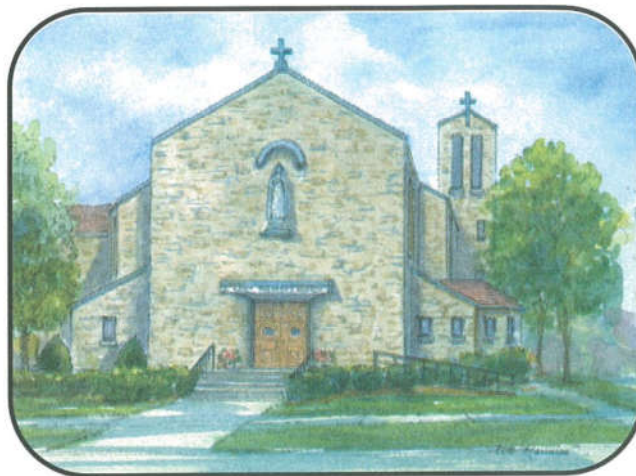

# 32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

## Reflection from Sr. Helen Flemington

### 32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time, 2017

St. Paul takes the straightforward approach. He comes right out and says *"I don't want you to be ignorant of the truth, friends. Since we believe Jesus died and rose again, we know that God will personally take up everyone who dies."* Paul goes on to describe a glorious scene—how Jesus is coming back again, and how, at that moment those already dead and those still living will all meet together with Jesus in the air. It sounds like he's picturing the family reunion to end all family reunions.

The gospel about the 10 bridesmaids who fell asleep waiting for the bridegroom tells us more about how to wait until all things are well again. All of us are like the bridesmaids, waiting for Jesus to come again and bring healing and peace to our troubled lives and world. And some of us already feel like we've been waiting a lot longer than others! But some people are wiser than others. When the waiting starts to seem long and tiring, the foolish ones will let themselves get distracted by non-essentials or drop out of the community entirely, unable to believe in Jesus' promises. But the wise among us will hang on. They'll turn to each other for words of encouragement, they'll tell stories of love and support in the midst of pain. Maybe they'll sing songs and paint pictures to remind themselves of God's promises. They'll keep their sense of humor and their hearts open and ready for the unexpected return of the bridegroom.

St. Paul says, *"Don't grieve meaninglessly. Don't grieve without seeing that tiny beam of hope way down the tunnel. Don't despair utterly—because God really is there in your pain."*

## Weekly Health Corner



### Do You Have Sleep Problems???

Do you awaken in the morning and still feel tired? Are you awake many times through-out the night? Do you awaken others with your snoring? Do you notice that your legs are very restless when you try to go to sleep? These are some of the sleep problems that can keep you from getting a good night's sleep.

If you have problems with sleep talk to your doctor about them. You may need a Sleep Study. A sleep study is usually done in a sleep lab. You spend one night in the lab and the tech. monitors your sleep through-out the night. Then an MD studies your results and makes recommendations as to what will help you get a good night's sleep every night. Some problems need medications (usually not sleeping pills) to help you.

If you have sleep apnea or hypopnea you may need a C-pap machine. Sleep apnea is a condition where the person actually stops breathing for a period of time and may do this 10 to 100+ times a night. Hypopnea is a condition where for some reason the oxygen level in the person falls below normal while sleeping. Both of these conditions, if moderate to severe can be very hard on your heart. The brain measures the amount of oxygen you are getting and if it is below normal the brain makes the heart pump faster and faster to try to keep your oxygen level higher. This over working of your heart can lead to heart failure. The C-pap machine can be worn at night and it helps to push air into your lungs so that you take deeper breaths than you normally would. This in turn should help keep your breathing regular and raise your oxygen level to normal and thus you sleep more deeply. There are different masks and nasal pieces that you can wear to get the oxygen into your lungs.

These take time to adjust to but it is worth the time as you begin to sleep better and feel better. If you have questions about this ask Sr. Helen Alder--she is on a machine and it really helps.

On January 1st, 2018, adult adoptees (ages 18 and older) will be granted access to their original birth certificate. Birth parents have the right to protect their confidentiality under the new law, but they must act before January 1st.

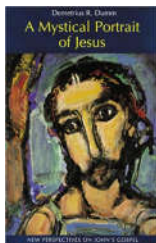

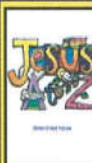

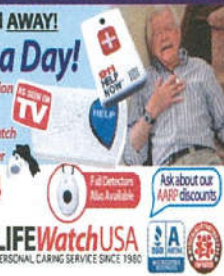
