Reflection from Sr. Helen Flemington

The human heart is filled with mystery. It is in the depths of our heart that we find all kinds of desires and longings —longings for love, longings for meaning, longing for attachment to other human beings. It is there that we experience the wonder of who we are; it is in the heart that we find our thirst for life, and for a life that is full and vibrant. And if we are open enough, it is in the depths of our heart that we discover the God of love. The Father, Son and Holy Spirit have made their home in our human heart.

We live our faith in the Trinity by living our lives in a Trinitarian fashion. Today as we celebrate the deepest mystery of our Christian faith, we are also celebrating the deepest mystery of our human lives. May our Triune God continue to bless our efforts at building and sustaining true relationships of love in our families, parishes and in our world.

Health Corner: Building Strong Bones

May is National Mental Month. Depression is one of the most common mental illnesses. The understanding of the nature and causes of depression has evolved over the centuries, but the understanding is still incomplete. Causes may be psychological, psychosocial, hereditary, evolutionary and biological. Depression affects a person's family and personal relationships, work or school life, sleeping and eating habits and general health. Some of the physical symptoms are fatigue, headaches, digestive problems, decreased appetite, and weight loss. However, occasionally there may be an increased appetite resulting in weight gain. Insomnia is common with depression affecting at least 80% of depressed people. About 15% may have hypersomnia in which they oversleep. Depression may coexists with chronic disorders particularly with the elderly. About 5% of US children and adolescents have depression. Clinical depression is very treatable. One of the most common treatments is antidepressant medication and therapy. Of those who seek help more
