Reflection from Sr. Helen Flemington

6th Sunday of Easter 2018

With today's gospel reading we return again to the heart of Christianity, to the heart of life, to the heart of the universe: *This is my commandment,* that you love one another as I have loved you. We also hear those remarkable words: God is love.

If there were ever words to live by, they are the words contained in today's Gospel. We have to constantly re-visit these words—to savor them once again, to look closely at what they are calling us to. We can never exhaust the meaning of these words for our lives because our lives are always changing. And the change we experience calls for a change in the way we live out that commandment to love.

We all know that happiness has never been the same as pleasure and fulfillment. It has never come with being able to get everything we want. Saying 'yes' to ourselves and others with regard to gaining more possessions, getting more stuff, can be a very big mistake. It can lead to a lot of pressure to work even longer hours, or even cheat others so that we can have more. At times in our families we have to firmly say 'no' to the new car or television or the expensive holiday we know we can't afford. When we say 'no' to acquiring more possessions, at the same time we are saying 'yes' to being able to give more to the poor, or having more time to spend with our family.

I do not want to end this reflection without drawing your attention to what are perhaps the three most important words in Scripture. These words are in the second reading today: *God is love*. St. Augustine commenting on these words says this: *Now observe that to act contrary to love is to act contrary to God*. When we say 'no' to others out of love, at the same time we are saying 'yes' to the God who is love.

Many people have grown up with home



remedies for different problems, but one thing that is helpful is to have an up-to-date first aid kit in the home and even sometimes in the car. Here are some important items:

- 1) disposable gloves- to protect yourself
- 2) Adhesive bandage- help with small cuts
- 3) Roll of gauze- for larger bandages
- 4) Gauze pads- to cover wounds
- 5) Non-stick dressings- to cover burns and scrapes
- 6) Elastic or Ace bandage- to bind or support an injury
- 7) Clear tape- to secure bandages
- 8) Tweezers to remove ticks and splinters
- 9) Scissors- to cut bandages
- 10) Hydrogen peroxide- to help clean wounds
- 11 Pain relievers (aspirin, ibuprofen, acetaminophen)
- 12) Baking soda- to control itching
- 13) Vaseline and antibiotic ointment-to apply to cuts and scrapes


