

Reflection from Sr. Helen Flemington

Second Sunday of Lent

During our "Journey of 40 days" we are asked to reflect on our Savior's suffering, death and resurrection. We are asked in some ways to walk with the one who suffered for us. In St. Paul's letter to Timothy he sends this invitation: "Brothers and sisters: Join with me in suffering for the gospel. Relying on the power of God, who saved us and called us with a holy calling."

The Good News of Jesus can bring hardship. Many of us continue to be surprised at this fact. We still naively think that if we are doing God's will, then we will not have to suffer. It's true that we probably wouldn't put it that way. We wouldn't say that because I follow Jesus we won't suffer. We really suffer because we are Christians- following Jesus' way which is not always the way of the world.

When Jesus came down from the mountain after being transfigured, he told his apostles not to tell anyone about it until after he had risen from the dead. He knew that he would have to suffer. He also knew that his followers would have to suffer. But he promises that he will always be with us, especially as we walk in his footsteps and bear the burdens that come with faithfulness.

Let's conclude with words from St. Francis de Sales: Do not look forward in fear to the changes of life. Rather look to them with full hope that as they arise, God, whose very own you are, will lead you safely through all things. And when you cannot stand it, God will carry you in His arms. Do not fear what may happen tomorrow. The same everlasting Father who cares for you today will take care of you today and every day. He will either shield you from suffering or will give you unfailing strength to bear it. Be at peace and put aside all anxious thoughts and imaginations.

Bishop James Johnston will celebrate Mass at St. Therese Little Flower on Sunday, March 19, 2017. We will have only one Mass at 9:00 am so that we might have the opportunity for a reception to welcome him and have an opportunity to meet and greet.

Health Corner: Tornado Season



Are you prepared for Tornado Season? Do you and your children know where to take cover? Most of us have heard that it is best to go to the basement of our homes and stay away

from windows and anything that might fall on us. Or if no basement go to a room or hallway that is without windows and lie or crouch down---get in the bath tub. Then cover your self with a pillow and blanket. If you are in a vehicle stop immediately, get out and lie in a low ditch. NEVER stay in the vehicle or park under a bridge or overpass. The State of MO Emergency Management Agency has a website to help us prepare for severe weather.

The website: <u>stormaware.mo.gov</u> includes videos on how to take shelter during a storm, information about tornados sirens and weather alert radios and links to severe weather texting services to receive alerts about upcoming severe weather.


