#### THE CATHOLIC STEWARD



Acts 1: 1-11; Ps 47:2-3, 6-9; Eph 1:17-23; Mr 28:16-20

Today, we celebrate the great feast of the Ascension of our Lord, that glorious moment when Jesus, 40 days after His resurrection, was lifted up — quite literally— into heaven, as the apostles watched in stunned amazement. It is recounted in both our first reading, from Acts, as well as the Gospel passage, from Matthew. It must have been an extraordinary thing to witness.

But the first reading tells us that the apostles were not permitted to simply bask in the moment for very long. "While they were looking intently at the sky as he was going, suddenly two men dressed in white garments stood beside them. They said, 'Men of Galilee, why are you standing there looking at the sky?"

In other words, "Don't just stand there, do something!"

This verse is a call to each one of us Christian stewards this very day. We have been given every grace and blessing through the Mass and all of the sacraments, through the Word of God, the rich teachings of our faith, and even our talents and our material possessions.

And like those first apostles, we are not meant to just stand here, but to do something with these gifts — in love and gratitude to the One Who gave them to us. We are called, just as much as the first apostles "to be [His] witnesses... to the ends of the earth," not with our own power, but through the power of the Holy Spirit in us.

# Mass at St. Therese Little Flower

Mass will be offered at St. Therese Little Flower Church on Sunday, May 24, 2020-9 a.m. with limited attendance.

The Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph states: "All four (Missouri) Diocesan Bishops have dispensed the faithful from the obligation to attend Mass on Sunday and from the Easter Duty. As such, we will continue to provide Mass on line until further notice.

- Those who are symptomatic or who have been exposed to another with the virus within 14 days are not permitted to enter the church, in accordance with national, state, and local health directives. All attendees are asked to check their temperature at home before coming to church.
- Those who are at risk because of an underlying health issue or who are 60 or older are strongly encouraged, for their own health, to avoid the risk of attending public celebrations of the Mass.

If you are on our email list, **you will receive a notice for Mass "reservations" via Eventbrite**. If you prefer, you may call St. Therese and leave a message of your attendance (include the total number attending). Message should be left in Estelle Tunley's mailbox, Extension 106.

Please check email for **Eventbrite** notices for each week's Mass since there will be limits in the church as we follow local guidance. This will allow us to monitor the number who will attend.

There will be information at the church to assist you in adapting to the changes in place for Mass.

Please continue to pray for our community that we will all be able to gather at the Lord's Table again soon.

We will continue to offer weekend video Mass until further notice. Weekday Mass on Wednesday and Friday will begin on June 3 in the main sanctuary.



Spring and summer are the seasons where more suicides occur. Knowing the signs of severe depression are very important in order to prevent suicide. Some of the signs of depression are: being sad/depressed most of the time, anxiety, agitation, sleeplessness and mood swings. The person may verbalize guilt or shame, or that there is no reason to live or they may have rage/anger or engage in risky activities. They may lose interest in things they use to enjoy: hobbies, work, school, etc. There may be an increase of alcohol or drug use. Other signs are that they may withdraw from friends and loved ones, give away prized possessions or neglect their physical appearance.







